How does it work?

- ☐ A signed contract and \$200 deposit is required for each training.
- ☐ No training will be provided for less than 5 participants.
- ☐ In scheduling a training, a center should provide us with at least two (2) possible training dates and times preferred.
- ☐ Allow at least four (4) weeks to schedule a training.
- ☐ Center will ensure that each staff member registers separately for the training on NJCCIS using the Event ID# provided by CCCS.
- ☐ Payment for all participants must be received five (5) business days before the day of training.
- ☐ 48-hours prior notice is required to cancel a training. A 25% cancellation fee will be charged on all cancelled trainings unless training is rescheduled within 30 days.
- ☐ A Certificate of Completion will be provided in NJCCIS for each participant within one week of the training. Participants must complete the full training in order to receive a certificate.
- ☐ Depending on the topic, limits may be placed on the number of participants in the training, especially those involving activities.
