# WEBINAR ETIQUETTE



When attending a class or meeting via Zoom, portray yourself in the best light possible as a professional by following these tips on preparedness and general Zoom etiquette.

- **Designate Your Workspace**  
Ensure your workspace is quiet, clean, and has an appropriate background, or use virtual background.
- **Set Up Your Tech**  
Check your Wi-Fi, test your video and audio, and get familiar with the software before entering the meeting.

- **Communicate with the Host**  
Zoom includes nonverbal feedback buttons for raising your hand, responding yes or no, asking the host to adjust speed, requesting a break, and more. Please use them.
- **Be Professional**  
Be on time to meetings, dress appropriately, and sit tall and look directly into the camera when using the video.
- **Avoid Embarrassing Mistakes**  
Pay attention to your video, microphone, and screen sharing settings to avoid embarrassing mistakes.  
Always keep the chat rooms appropriate to the content of the session.

Please ensure that you have a working camera and are located in a semi-private environment to be able to fully engage in conversation for this training. *In addition, to receive full professional development credit you are expected to keep your camera on for the entire duration of the training and to be actively participating in all activities and discussions.* We understand that often technical difficulties prevent your use of a camera, please let us know when this occurs so we are aware of the situation.

- **Comunicarse con la anfitriona**

- **Ser Profesional**  
Llegue a tiempo a las reuniones, vístase adecuadamente, siéntese derecha y mire directamente a la cámara cuando use el video.
- **Evita errores vergonzosos**  
Preste atención a la configuración de video, micrófono y pantalla compartida para evitar errores vergonzosos. Mantenga siempre las salas de chat adecuadas al contenido de la sesión.

Asegúrese de tener una cámara trabajando y estar ubicada en un entorno semiprivado para poder participar plenamente en la conversación para esta capacitación. Además, para recibir el crédito de desarrollo profesional completo, se espera que mantenga su cámara encendida durante toda la duración de la capacitación y que participe activamente en todas las actividades y discusiones.
